

















<p><i>Agathis australis</i> KAURI</p> 	<p>Aotearoa's most ancient and majestic native trees with some specimens living for over 2,000 years and reaching heights of 50 meters with trunk diameters of several meters. Renowned for their massive, straight trunks and distinctive gum, Kauri forests create unique ecosystems with specially adapted plant communities. Today, these magnificent trees face significant threats from kauri dieback disease, making their conservation a national priority. <p><i>Alectryon excelsa</i> TITOKI</p> 	<p>Makes an attractive specimen tree which is densely covered in khaki green coloured, tooth shaped leaves attractive scarlet red fruit with a black eye. Attracts native birds and its leaves and oil are a natural insect repellent. Frost tender when young. Prefers rich/free draining soils.</p>	<p>\$15.00 6.5 Pot</p>
<p><i>Anemanthele lessoniana</i> HAUANGAMOHO Wind Grass</p> 	<p>Graceful tussock-forming grass distinguished by its feathery flower heads and elegantly arching foliage with a captivating copper-tinged hue. Makes an impressive statement when mass planted in full sun or adds a touch of elegance in semi-shaded areas under trees. Versatile in various conditions.</p>	<p>\$6.00 13cm Pot</p>
<p><i>Apodasmia similis</i> OIOI, Jointed rush</p> 	<p>The delicate leaves have brown joints at various points along the leaf. A stunning prehistoric reed, endemic to Aotearoa. It can transform from dark green to a bright orange. It prefers swampy wet areas but is very versatile once established it can tolerate long dry spells. 



<p>Aristotelia serrata MAKOMAKO, Wineberry</p> 	<p>The soft, heart-shaped leaves of Makomako are light green on top and tinged red underneath and edged with sharp serrations, just like the teeth of its namesake, the Mako shark. It has lovely rose-coloured flowers in spring, followed by black berries in summer that attract native birds. Fast growing. Frost tender when young.</p>	<p>\$3.50 Tube</p>
<p>Arthropodium bifurcatum RENGA RENG</p> 	<p>A native lily. It forms a clump of wide bright green leaves, From late spring to mid-summer it sends up multiple bracts of 1m tall flower stems, covered in small white flowers with a sweet fragrance, great for bees. A magnificent landscaping plant ideal for mass plantings. Great for erosion control and holding together banks. Grows in a range of soil conditions . Semi shade, frost tender. 1m wide and 60cm high.</p>	<p>\$6.00 13cm pot</p>
<p>Asplenium bulbiferum PIKOPIKO, Hen And Chicken Fern</p> 	<p>Lush, arching fronds and ability to produce baby ferns (plantlets) along the leaf edges. Ideal for shaded gardens, underplanting, or pots, it thrives in moist, well-drained soil with protection from direct sun and wind. This fern adds a soft, tropical feel to any space and is low-maintenance, making it a favourite for both indoor and outdoor use.</p>	<p>\$29.00 6.5L POT</p>

<p><i>Astelia fragrans</i> KAKAHA, Bush lily</p> 	<p>A large species of <i>Astelia</i>. The broad green leaves, up to 2m long and stiffly arching, are overlaid with a silvery sheen and the ribs are often reddish. Scented spring flowers. Orange berries on female plants attract birds. An excellent filler for a large space in semi shade.</p>	<p>Currently out of stock</p>
<p><i>Atriplex cinerea</i> MĀTAITAI</p> 	<p>Perfect for coastal gardens. Upright stems with silver leaves provide textural and colour contrast. Can be trimmed if necessary.</p>	<p>\$12.00 17cm POT</p>
<p><i>Austroderia richardii</i> TOETOE (South Island Toetoe)</p> 	<p>A large, fast-growing coarse green tussock. Versatile revegetation and erosion-control plant, and useful low shelter on wet and dry sites. Attractive creamy white flower heads to 2-3m from December-January. <p><i>Brachyglottis greyi</i> COOK STRAIGHT DAISY</p> 	<p>A spreading shrub with daisy-like yellow blooms for most of the year. Great amongst rocks. Silver-edged grey-green leaves make a great contrast against dark foliage. Tolerant of hot sun, poor soils, wind and coastal exposure. At Risk – Declining</p>	<p>\$10 17cm POT</p>





<p>Brachyglottis monroi</p> <p>Brachyglottis monroi</p> 	<p>A bushy shrub that reaches a height of 1 meter. The leaves are spear-shaped, olive green above and white below with crenate, wavy edges. Attractive bright yellow flowers in summer. Tolerant of hot sun, poor soils and wind. Needs good drainage.</p>	<p>\$15.00 6.5L POT</p>
<p>Carex buchananii</p> <p>Leather leaf sedge</p> 	<p>Carex buchananii, Leatherleaf Sedge: An attractive reddish grass, with blonde tips, a tidy disciplined form and upright silvery flower spikes. This Carex will grow almost anywhere & keeps its color all year long. Good for mass plantings, along borders, or even in containers. It looks best contrasted with green plants. <p>Carex Comans</p> <p>'Bronze'</p> 	<p>'Bronz' is a low growing sedge with drooping spreading leaves with reddish brown foliage. The tips of the fine narrow leaves are often blonde. Flowering stems lie along the ground as they mature. Tolerant of a range of conditions and very good for the front of a border or grouped as a ground cover. <p>Carex dissita Carex dissita</p> 	<p>An attractive sedge with an arching habit. The ribbed leaves are a fresh bright green and contrast with the very dark brown seed heads. It can be grown in quite shady areas, such as under trees, moist soil and cool root zone. It is ideal for revegetation of the water margin area of wetlands and streams. <p>Carex secta PUKIO</p> 	<p>A sedge with fine leaves and arching form. It is the only sedge to grow a trunk, so it can cope with fluctuating water levels making it the perfect plant for stream sides and wetland edges.. Great bird habitat. <p>Carex virgata Carex virgata</p>	<p>Carex virgata: is a vigorous sedge of swampy areas throughout New Zealand. It has narrow arching bright green leaves and grows to about 90cm. <p><i>Carmichaelia australis</i> TARARANGAHAPE, Native Broom</p> 	<p>An upright bush with tiny inconspicuous leaves and small, white flowers with a purple centre, clustered along twigs. Fruit a small dry pointed pod containing 1-3 hard orange seeds. Stems are flattened. Attractive to pollinators. Prefers full sun and tolerates dry, windy and cold sites. Hardy.</p>	<p>\$3.50 Tube</p>
<p><i>Carmichaelia odorata</i> Scented broom</p> 	<p>It is a graceful shrub with slender stems and delicate purple flowers that release a pleasant fragrance in summer. This evergreen shrub brings softness, fragrance to gardens while also supporting pollinators. It tolerates dry, exposed, and coastal conditions. <p><i>Carpodetus serratus</i> PUTAPUTAWETA, Marbleleaf</p> 	<p>Tangled juvenile form turns into an attractive small tree with large leaves at maturity. Attractive marbled foliage. Beautiful star shaped white flowers followed by purple fruit, which ripen to black. Does best on a moist semi-shaded site. <p><i>Chionochloa flavicans</i> TOE TOE Miniature</p> 	<p>A striking tussock with arching green foliage and feathery seed heads, it adds texture and movement to garden landscapes. <p>Clematis paniculata PUAWANANGA, New Zealand Clematis</p> 	<p>A very attractive climber with masses of white flowers in spring. Prefers moist but well-drained soil with roots in a cool shady place and foliage in the sun. Frost hardy.</p>	<p>Currently out of stock</p>
<p>Clanthus maximus Kōwhai ngutukākā whero, Red kakabeak</p> 	<p>Named for its beautiful red flowers, which hang in clusters of 15-20 blooms and are shaped like a Kākā bird beak. Ngutu means beak/lips. Sometimes has more than one flush of flowers per year, starting to flower mid-winter. Tui will thank you for it. Being a member of the pea family, Ngutukākā can fix nitrogen, enabling it to grow in infertile sites.</p>	<p>\$12.00 17cm POT</p>

<p>Coprosma acerosa TĀTARAHEKE</p> 	<p>A coastal shrub with a low growing compact spreading tangled orange branches and small lime green elongated leaves, can tolerate very poor soils but likes good drainage. <p><i>Coprosma virescens</i> MIKIMIKI</p> 	<p>Has golden coppery glow from its extremely tangled branches with tiny leaves. The fruit is white/green-tinged, an important food source for birds. <p><i>Cordyline australis</i> TĪ KŌUKA, Cabbage tree</p> 	<p>Long narrow leaves and lovely scented flowers in early summer, which turn into bluish-white berries that birds love to eat. As the plant gets old, the stems may die but new shoots grow from any part of the trunk. The bark is thick and tough like cork, and a huge fleshy taproot anchors the tree firmly into the ground. <p>Dacrycarpus dacrydioides KAHIKATEA</p> 	<p>Is a coniferous tree endemic to Aotearoa. The slow growing tree can reach a height of 55 metres with a trunk that is buttressed at the base. <p>Dacrydium cupressinum RIMU, Red pine</p> 	<p>Excellent specimen and timber tree with graceful pendulous, willow-like branchlets when young. Fruit from March to May attracts birds. Prefers a fertile moist sheltered, frost-free site while young, tolerating more exposure when mature. Rimu grows up to 50m and has a straight trunk with a dense conical crown shape.</p>	<p>Currently out of stock</p>
<p>Dianella nigra TŪRUTU</p> 	<p>Highly attractive flax-like plant with showy purple berries on long stems in summer through to autumn. Prefers moist and semi shade situations, but tolerant of both dry and sun. Hardy.</p>	<p>\$8.00 14 cm POT</p>

<p>Didymocheton spectabilis Kohekohe, New Zealand mahogany</p> 	<p>Has sweetly scented orchid-like flowers that grow straight from the trunk the leaves are oval, glossy green giving a tropical appearance . 

<p><i>Dodonaea viscosa</i>: Red AKEAKE Whero</p> 	<p>A fast growing tree. It is hardy and can cope with wind. Akeake has long narrow light green leaves with slightly wavy margins. Male and female flowers occur on separate trees and the papery seed capsules are quite a distinct feature. Akeake makes an excellent screen or windbreak that can protect less hardy plants.</p>	<p>\$3.50 Tube</p>
<p><i>Elaeocarpus dentatus</i> HĪNAU</p> 	<p>It has dark green leaves and produces clusters of small, white flowers in spring. The flowers evolve into fleshy, olive shaped fruit in summer. <p><i>Elaeocarpus hookerianus</i> PŌKĀKĀ</p> 	<p>Small tree with distinct small narrow glossy olive-green and red wavy leaves on zig zagging interlacing branches on juvenile plants, that then develop much larger adult green leaves on straight erect twigs. Flowers white, lacy, drooping, in small sprays. Fruit dark purple, oval. Moist fertile soil, semi shade.</p>	<p>\$15.00 5.0L POT</p>





Entelea arborescens WHAU 	Has very large soft attractive heart shaped, serrated leaves giving a tropical appearance. The pretty white flowers occur in early summer, followed by the spiny fruit that resemble a chestnut burr or thistle. The wood is extremely light, weighing half that of cork. Whau is fast growing, to about 3m, making it a useful filler and a rapid shade producer great as nurse plant. Its distinctive appearance also makes it suitable for inclusion in a tropical planting or as a feature plant. Will tolerate poorer dry conditions. Does not tolerate heavy frost.	\$10.00 PB6.5
Euphorbia glauca WAIŪATUA, Shore Spurge 	A rare coastal plant of great ecological importance with a wide creeping habit. Foliage colour varies from pastel green to vivid blue-grey with red stems. Attractive red/pink flowers from September to March. Great ornamental plant for dry sites.	\$ 15.00 5.0L POT
Ficinia nodosa Wiwi, Knobby club rush 	A bit like a giant dandelion head in shape or an upside down umbrella; its long thin stalks spread out evenly. It can be found in sand dunes so it can cope with the dryness of summer and the dampness of winter. Great for effluent field plantings, beach restoration jobs, and wet patches in paddocks. Ficinia spiralis PĪNGAO, Golden sand sedge 	Stout, yellow-green when fresh, golden when dry, short creeping plants with stiff leaves. Coastal sand dune systems. It favours sloping and more or less unstable surfaces, growing mostly on the front face of active dunes but also on the rear face and rear dunes, provided that there is wind-blown sand. It can also grow on the top of sand hills. It is effective at trapping sand. At Risk – Declining.	Grown to order, one year in advance \$4.20 Tube





<p><i>Fuchsia excorticata</i> KŌTUKUTUKU, Tree Fuchsia</p> 	<p>Might be a small tree but it is the world's largest fuchsia with stunning orange-brown papery bark and interesting twisted shape. Purple-red flowers from early spring to summer. Initially green and yellow flowers change to pink-purple, with bright blue pollen they are a rich source of nectar for birds and bees. Worth growing to see how bird beaks get covered in glowing blue pollen! Prefers a moist soil. Deciduous.</p>	<p>\$12.00 17cm Pot</p>
